Authorization

The Fostering Connections to Success and Increasing Adoptions Act of 2008, Public Law 110- 351, (Fostering Connections) provides federally-recognized Indian Tribes, Indian Tribal Organizations and Consortia (Indian Tribes) with the option to submit a plan to the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) to operate a title IV-E program directly (section 479B of the Social Security Act).

Prevention and Family Services Programs

- Five-year title IV-E prevention program plan and pre-print
- KN pre-print
 - must assist kinship caregivers in learning about, finding, and using programs and services to meet the needs of the children they are raising and 1 their own needs, and to promote effective partnerships among public and private agencies to ensure kinship caregiver families are served

"Chafee" Foster Care Program and ETV Programs



- John H. Chafee Foster Care Program for Successful Transition to Adulthood
 - To help youth who have experienced foster care at age 14 or older achieve self-sufficiency by providing educational assistance, career exploration, vocational training, life skills training, substance abuse prevention, preventive health activities, and opportunities to engage in age or developmentally-appropriate activities
- Educational and Training Vouchers
 - \$5,000 per year per youth for post-secondary education and training for eligible youth


